Advanced Practice Providers

- **Q:** How does Governor Baker's temporary removal of a supervising MD for the issuing of prescriptions impact our advanced practice providers (APPs)?
- **A:** Providers are impacted in the following ways:
 - certified midwives: no change.
 They continue to have independent practice
 - nurse practitioners with more than two years of experience: are allowed to work in other areas of the hospital without having to identify a new prescriptive supervising MD
 - nurse practitioners with less than two years of experience: continue to need a prescriptive supervising MD
 - physician assistants: the need for a supervising MD has not been lifted

Billing: When performing virtual visits (video or telephone) log in to Epic as independent and bill independently. "Incident to" does not apply to virtual visits.
