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#### In the News

- <u>Zubsolv</u>, a sublingual buprenorphine-naloxone combination, received FDA approval for maintenance treatment of opioid dependence.
- The DEA published an updated list of <u>medication-related licensing authorities</u> granted to different Mid-Level Practitioners, including each professions' authority to administer, dispense, order and prescribe medications of varying schedules, categorized by state.
- FDA partnership with international regulatory and law enforcement agencies resulted in a recent, worldwide seizure of over \$41 million in illegal, unapproved prescription medications, and the issuance of warnings and closures of 9,600 illegal online pharmacies that sold them.
- The National Community Pharmacists Association's "Report Card on Medication Adherence" surveyed 1,020 adults taking chronic prescription medications. Among patients on analgesics, self-adjustment in dose and frequency were the most common non-adherent behaviors. Feelings of personal connectedness to the pharmacy and provider continuity were found to be the greatest predictors of medication adherence, reinforcing the importance of developing effective patient-provider relationships with open communication.
- The CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Report describes <u>opioid use among women</u> based on data from 2004-2010. While men are more likely to die of opioid-related overdose, hospitalizations for opioid overdoses have been increasing among women, many of which were complicated by medications prescribed for co-morbid psychological disorders. Balancing the pharmacological risks and benefits of pain management in women should take these factors into account, as well as the risks associated with medications and pregnancy.

- De Oliveira GS, Castro-Alves LJ, Khan JH, et al. <u>Perioperative systemic magnesium</u> to minimize postoperative pain: A meta-analysis of randomized controlled trials. *Anesthesiology*. 2013;119(1):178-90. Intraoperative and postoperative administration of systemic magnesium during general anesthesia was found to consistently reduce post-operative pain levels as well as opioid consumption.
- Smith SM, Wang AT, Katz NP, et al. <u>Adverse event assessment, analysis, and reporting</u> in recent published analgesic clinical trials: ACTTION systematic review and recommendations. *Pain.* 2013;154(7):997-1008. Despite efforts to standardize documentation, the occurrence of adverse events was found to be poorly and inconsistently reported in a review of 80 analgesic randomized controlled trials. A checklist of recommendations was developed for investigators to better categorize and document analgesic adverse events.

- Apfelbaum JL, Silverstein JH, Chung FF, et al. <u>Practice guidelines for postanesthetic care</u>: an updated report by the American Society of Anesthesiologists Task Force on Postanesthetic Care. <u>Anesthesiology</u>. 2013;118(2):291-307. Updated recommendations include topics on patient assessment and monitoring, treatment and prevention of nausea and vomiting, emergence and recovery, and pharmacology.
- Fishman SM, Young HM, Lucas Arwood E, et al. <u>Core competencies for pain management</u>: Results of an interprofessional consensus summit. *Pain Med.* 2013;14(7):971-81. Four domains of pain education were defined: basics of pain and its impact on person and society; assessing and measuring pain; collaborative pain management; and, the context of pain across different settings and populations.
- Valrie CR, Bromberg MH, Palermo T, et al. A systematic review of <u>sleep in pediatric pain populations</u>. *J Dev Behav Pediatr*.
   2013;34(2):120-8. A bidirectional model of sleep and pain proposes that high pain levels reduce sleep quality; conversely, poor sleep increases pain levels and pain sensitivity the next day. Proper assessment of sleep quality is crucial for children with chronic pain.

- The FDA created a safety campaign to create public awareness of the dangers of concurrent acetaminophen sources in OTC products.
- The American Chronic Pain Association updated their comprehensive Resource Guide on pain medication options for chronic pain.

  Initially written for patients, this document also covers non-pharmacological interventions and is relevant to all health care providers.
- American Geriatrics Society's <u>printable pocket-reference</u> of the Beers Criteria for Potentially Inappropriate Medication Use in Older Adults.
