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In the News

- DEA will sponsor another <u>National Rx Drug Take-Back Day Oct. 22, 2016</u> to disposing unwanted Rx drugs, while educating the public.
- Health & Human Services awards \$53 million to help address opioid epidemic by improving access to treatment for overdose and addiction.
- US Surgeon General asks professions to pledge to <u>Turn The Tide</u> ending the opioid overdose epidemic by learning safe, effective pain control.
- Massachusetts sends prescribers a <u>list of over 100 non-opioid medications</u>, however, many are either for specific pains and/or for off-label use
- FDA approves a new radio frequency device for chronic low back pain that destroy basivertebral pain nerves within vertebrae that cause pain.
- The effect of opioid policy changes may have hurt pain patients, as prescriptions since 2012 dropped 15%, while overdose deaths climb.
- Virtual Reality to help cope with pain is increasingly being used at hospitals as the costs of hardware is down and patient acceptance is high.
- Many overdose deaths result from the <u>combination of opioids and benzodiazepines</u>, that FDA will highlight these risks in boxed warnings.
- Since 2012, a 15% cut in opioid prescriptions has paralleled a rise in opioid death rates, suggesting new laws may miss the mark.
- A fundraiser is focusing on pain research & opioid abuse as a Women's Health issue. Your donation could help them win a million!
- In Massachusetts, 85% of opioid overdoses are from illicit heroin illicit fentanyl, with only 8% from a recent legitimate opioid prescription.
- Massachusetts Board of Nursing revised its Advisory Ruling on Pain Management to require APRN training related to opioid abuse & Narcan

Incidence of and risk factors for chronic opioid use among opioid-naive patients in the postoperative period. *JAMA Intern Med*. 2016 Sep 1;176(9):1286-93.On average <1% of surgical patients progress to chronic opioid use, with men, older age, and preoperative drug or alcohol abuse, and those with preoperative depression, benzodiazepine or antidepressant use at increased risk
- Oppermann J, Bredow J, Spies CK, et al. <u>Effect of prolonged-released oxycodone / naloxone</u> in postoperative pain management after total knee replacement: a nonrandomized prospective trial. *J Clin Anesth*. 2016 Sep;33:491-7. Post-operative oxycodone/naloxone reduces pain and side effects while improving participation in Physical Therapy, and reducing constipation after surgery.
- Chambers J, Gleason RM, Kirsh KL, et al. An online survey of patients' experiences since the <u>rescheduling of hydrocodone</u>: The first 100 days. *Pain Med*. 2016 Sep;17(9):1686-93. Regulations that reassigned hydrocodone to a Schedule II drug to curb abuse has resulted in less effective treatments, higher costs, missed work days, suicidal ideation and strained professional–patient relationships.
- Booth JL, Harris LC, Eisenach JC, et al. A randomized controlled trial comparing two multimodal analgesic techniques in patients predicted to
 have severe pain after cesarean delivery. *Anesth Analg.* 2016 Apr;122(4):1114-9. Higher dose of spinal morphine plus scheduled
 acetaminophen cut post c-section pain with movement the next day by 1.5/10 points without an impact on long-term outcomes.
- Sil S, Cohen LL, Dampier C. Psychosocial and functional outcomes in youth with chronic sickle cell pain. *Clin J Pain*. 2016 Jun;32(6):527-33. Children with chronic sickle pain are disabled, depressed, & hospitalized more than those with intermittent pain of comparable intensity.

- Calcaterra SL, Drabkin AD, Leslie SE, et al. The hospitalist perspective on <u>opioid prescribing</u>: A qualitative analysis. *J Hosp Med*. 2016; 2016 Aug;11(8):536-42. Hospitalists can confidently prescribe opioids for acute pain, but not for those with acute flares of chronic pain.
- Noel M, Beals-Erickson SE, Law EF, et al. Characterizing the pain narratives of parents of youth with chronic pain. Clin J Pain. 2016
 Oct;32(10):849-58. Parental descriptions of their child's pain were categorized as distress narratives versus resilience narratives that would benefit from different approaches to education & counseling that address coping with affective responses, catastrophizing & helplessness.
- Coppieters I, Meeus M, Kregel J, et al. Relations between brain alterations & clinical pain measures in chronic musculoskeletal pain (MSK): A systematic review. *J Pain*. 2016 Sep;17(9):949-62. Brain imaging shows a links between structural & functional changes in the brain's somatosensory, affective & cognitive pain processing centers and clinically reported pain intensity, distribution, duration of chronic MSKP.
- PDQ. Cancer Pain Information Summary 2016 Aug. Evidence-based review of cancer pain overview & treatment.
- Tobias JD, Green TP, Coté CJ. Codeine: Time To Say "No." Pediatrics. 2016 Sep (Epub). Despite lack of efficacy and safety concerns expressed by the AAP, FDA & WHO; codeine is still given to children, a practice that should be stopped through education & restrictions.
- Eland J. A World-Wide Awareness of Pediatric Pain. *Pain Manag Nurs*. 2016 Aug;17(4):235-8. <u>Jo Eland, a pioneer</u> in the field of pediatric pain, who died this month, describes her journey of a career dedicated to world-wide control of pediatric pain and palliative care.

- The science is inconclusive, but points to small fiber and brain pathology in fibromyalgia as the underlying explanation of this disease.

CIH (Complementary Integrative Health approaches; formerly called Complementary Alternative Medicine [CAM])

- Mindfulness-Based Cognitive Therapy lowers pain intensity in women experiencing chronic post-breast cancer treatment pain.
- Research (50 years) on complementary approaches show acupuncture, yoga, massage & relaxation works for some pain types.
- Preliminary study shows a transient positive effect of <u>Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation for Phantom Limb Pain</u>
- A systematic review & meta-analysis of research on surgical patients shows massage alleviates pain & improves mood.
