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In the News

- USDHHS appointed a 28 member Pain Management Best Practices Inter-Agency Task Force address gaps & promote best pain treatments.
- Five <u>states sue opioid manufacturers</u> claiming over-prescribing raised health insurance costs to pay for overdoses and addiction treatment.
- US Food & Drug Administration invites chronic pain dialog about current therapy & challenges or barriers to accessing effective treatments.
- More than 95% of anesthesiologists indicate opioid shortages are affecting patients with more side effects, care interruptions & dissatisfaction.
- Efforts to solve the opioid crisis created new problems, including hospital shortages of IV opioids to dying patients enduring avoidable pain.
- US Food & Drug Administration approves <u>first non-opioid treatment for opioid withdrawal</u>; (an alpha-2 agonist) for up to 2 weeks of treatment.
- <u>Cannabis legalization may reduce opioid prescriptions</u>, but also <u>may increase non-medical use</u> of prescription drugs, a precursor to addiction.
- Massachusetts prescription opioid overdose deaths continue downward trend since 2014, with 85% of 2017 deaths linked to illicit fentanyl.
- Massachusetts revised advisory ruling states Nurse administered opioid dosing solely on pain intensity rating is inappropriate.
- Impact of the IV opioid shortage is changing care and fears among cancer patients, family members & the professionals who care for them.
- New class of migraine-preventing (calcitonin gene-related peptide) monoclonal antibodies is coming to market with different drugs in the cue.

- Jones CM, Einstein EB, Compton WM. Changes in Synthetic Opioid Involvement in Drug Overdose Deaths in the United States, 2010-2016. JAMA. 2018 May 1;319(17):1819-1821. Illicit fentanyl surpass prescription opioid & heroin deaths. Combined, they are the leading cause of overdose deaths. Fentanyl may be in heroin or counterfeit pills and 80% of fentanyl deaths mix it with alcohol &/or other drugs.
- Barbour KE, Moss S, Croft JB. Geographic variations in <u>arthritis prevalence</u>, health-related characteristics, & management United States, 2015. *MMWR Surveill Summ*. 2018 Mar 16;67(4):1-28. An estimated 54 million U.S. adults have arthritis at a cost of \$300 billion annually.
- Geenen R, Overman CL, Christensen R, et al. EULAR recommendations for the health professional's approach to <u>pain management in inflammatory arthritis and osteoarthritis</u>. Ann Rheum Dis. 2018 Jun;77(6):797-807. Overall, physical activity, exercise & psychological methods improve arthritis pain. All patients should receive education and multidisciplinary, multimodal therapy when monotherapy fails.
- Guay J, Parker MJ, Griffiths R, et al. <u>Peripheral Nerve Blocks for Hip Fractures</u>: A Cochrane Review. *Anesth Analg.* 2018 May;126(5):1695-1704. Nerve blocks reduce pain with movement, risk of pneumonia, & time to first mobilization; while cutting analgesic regimen cost.
- Vivolo-Kantor AM, Seth P, Gladden RM, et al. Vital Signs: Trends in emergency department visits for suspected opioid overdoses U.S., July 2016—September 2017. MMWR Morb Mortal Wkly. 2018 Mar 9;67(9):279-85. Significant rise in overdoses demand ED preparedness.
- Carvajal G, Dupoiron D, Seegers V, et al. <u>Intrathecal drug delivery systems for refractory pancreatic cancer pain</u>: observational follow-up study over an 11-year period in a comprehensive cancer center. *Anesth Analg*. 2018 Jun;126(6):2038-2046. Severe pancreatic pain was reduced from present in 90% to 5% of patients within a week with sustained analgesic benefits and common post-procedure complications.
- Simons LE, Sieberg CB, Conroy C, et al. <u>Children with chronic pain</u>: Response trajectories following intensive pain rehabilitation treatment. *J Pain* 2018 Feb;19(2):207-218. Anxiety & a lack of readiness to change are key factors related to failure of pediatric pain rehabilitation.

- Deyo RA, Hallvik SE, Hildebran C, et al. Use of prescription opioids before and after an operation for chronic pain. Pain. 2018 Jun;159(6):1147-54. Lumbar fusion surgery often fails to eliminate the need for opioids for patients on opioids before surgery.
- Bouhassira D, Attal N. Emerging therapies for neuropathic pain: new molecules or new indications for old treatments? *Pain*. 2018;159:576-582. Reviews emerging drug (e.g. NaV1.7 antagonists) & nondrug (e.g. noninvasive brain neurostimulation) therapies for neuropathic pain.
- Sepucha K, Atlas SJ, Chang Y, et al.. Patient decision aids improve decision quality, patient experience and reduce surgical rates in routine orthopaedic care: A prospective cohort study. J Bone Joint Surg Am. 2017 Aug 2;99(15):1253-1260. Patient-centered decision making improves satisfaction with pain relief, treatment & lowered regret about treatment chosen. It is also required by the 2018 TJC standards.
- Liossi C, Failo A, Schoth DE, et al. The effectiveness of online pain resources for health professionals: a systematic review with subset metaanalysis of educational intervention studies. Pain. 2018 Apr;159(4):631-643. Online professional instruction better imparts pain-related knowledge than traditional training strategies. Students also did better with online training than students educated by traditional methods.
- Rose, ME. Opioid analgesic prescribing: Facts vs. assumptions. Pain Med. 2018 Apr 1;19(4):793-807. Have regulatory, professional literature/conference proceedings & media reports created barriers to access for patients with clear medical indications for opioid analgesics?
- Nelson JC, Spyker DA. Morbidity and mortality associated with medications used in the treatment of depression: an analysis of cases reported to U.S. Poison Control Centers, 2000-2014. Am J Psychiatry. 2017 May 1;174(5):438-450. Antidepressants overdoses more than doubled in 15 years. Fatal cases overall increased by 32%; with suicide common and amitriptyline accounting for approximately 40% of fatalities.

- Shifting approaches to helping people with chronic pain, by integrating self-management & opioid-sparing strategies.
- User-friendly Geriatric Pain website has information for nurses and other people who care for older adults with pain.
- Scientific news on a variety of pain topics. Focus is on items of general interest rather than scientifically rigorous studies.
- The International Association for the Study of Pain has an updated curricula for professionals & interprofessional teams.

Complementary Integrative Health (formerly called Complementary Alternative Medicine [CAM])

- Acupuncture cut renal colic pain by 50% within 15 minutes in the ED & was better than morphine with fewer side effects.
- Relaxation, yoga &/or music during childbirth can reduce pain & improve satisfaction with pain relief, without affecting other delivery outcomes.
- Tai chi for fibromyalgia was as good or better that aerobic exercise, which has shown a variety of desirable outcomes for those with FM.
- A systematic review & meta-analysis of RCT's show weak evidence non-drug methods work to lessen pain in the Emergency Department.
