In the News

- Massachusetts Hospital Associations developed a guideline for Inpatient Opioid Misuse Prevention to improve care for those with OUD
- The FDA pushes for generic abuse-deterrent opioids because payers won't cover approved more expensive brand-name products.
- New Massachusetts law encourages specialist consultations for chronic pain and the use of complementary therapies.
- US Food and Drug Administration approves minimally-invasive, one or two-lead <u>peripheral nerve stimulators for non-drug pain relief.</u>
- The next National Prescription Drug Take Back Day is October 27, 2018. Urging all people to safely dispose of unused drugs.
- The National Academies of Sciences will write new opioid prescribing guidance for acute pain to supplement & update the CDC guidelines.
- Oregon moves to force Medicaid patients off opioids unless their pain is from cancer, sickle cell disease, or rheumatoid arthritis.
- Trump recommends federal <u>lawsuits to sue opioid manufacturers</u> for contributing to the opioid abuse crisis.
- Payers and lawmakers are increasingly forcing pain patients off opioids despite growing evidence of harm.
- Drug Enforcement Administration plans to <u>cut opioid quotas by another 10%</u> next year after cuts of 45% in the past two years.
- <u>Don't Punish Pain Rallies</u> are being held nationwide on September 18th. Over 60 rallies across America scheduled & could hit 100 by Sept.
- Fentanyl found in 89% of the opioid overdose deaths (toxicology confirmed) in Massachusetts this year with 34% testing positive for heroin.

- Bay S, Kuster L, McLean N, et al. A systematic review of psychological interventions in total hip and knee arthroplasty. BMC Musculoskelet Disord. 2018 Jun 21;19(1):201. Isolated techniques such as guided imagery or psychoeducational interventions alone don't improve outcomes after total knee or hip replacement surgery; as patient selection and comparative effectiveness trials are needed.
- Alexander MJ, Kiang MV, Barbieri M. <u>Trends in black and white opioid mortality</u> in the United States, 1979-2015. *Epidemiology*. 2018 Sep;29(5):707-715. Over 4 decades opioid mortality rose with a faster increase in mortality among whites & a back to illicit drugs recently.
- Hayhurst CJ, Jackson JC, Archer KR, et al. Pain and its long-term interference of daily life after critical illness. Anesth Analg. 2018 Sep;127(3):690-697. Three-quarters of ICU patients report chronic pain a year later, with ICU opioid use not linked to outcomes.
- Martucci KT, Mackey SC. Neuroimaging of pain: human evidence and clinical relevance of central nervous system processes and modulation. *Anesthesiology*. 2018 Jun;128(6):1241-1254. Neuroimaging of pain has improved our understanding of pain & its treatment.
- Comerci G Jr., Katzman J, Duhigg D. Controlling the swing of the <u>opioid pendulum</u>. *N Engl J Med*. 2018 Feb 22;378(8):691-693. A clear account of pressures faced by prescribers to stop treating patients with opioids, even when benefits outweigh risks.
- Bai J, Brubaker A, Meghani SH, et al. Spirituality and quality of life in black patients with cancer pain. *J Pain Symptom Manage*. 2018 Sep; 56(3):390-398. Spirituality among African Americans with cancer pain improves pain, biopsychosocial outcomes & measures of functioning.

- Bennell KL, Nelligan RK, Rini C, et al. Effects of internet-based pain coping skills training prior to home exercise for individuals with hip osteoarthritis (HOPE trial): a randomised controlled trial. Pain. 2018 Sep;159(9):1833-1842. Internet-based pain coping skills training improved pain & functioning for at least a year even without adherence to an exercise program. Benefits modestly improve with time.
- Richebe P, Capdevila X, Rivat C. Persistent postsurgical pain: pathophysiology and preventative pharmacologic considerations. Anesthesiology. 2018 Sep;129(3):590-607. Nerve inflammation & injury produces synaptic plasticity that amplifies/prolongs postsurgical pain.
- Indovina P, Barone D, Gallo L, et al. Virtual Reality as a distraction intervention to relieve pain and distress during medical procedures: A comprehensive literature review. Clin J Pain. 2018 Sep;34(9):858-877. VR is safe & effective for procedural pain & cancer-related discomfort.
- Aiyer R, Gulati A, Gungor S, et al. Treatment of chronic pain with various buprenorphine formulations: A systematic review of clinical studies. Anesth Analg. 2018 Aug;127(2):529-538. Buprenorphine in different formulations is a safe, effective analgesic for patients with chronic pain.
- Davis T, Loudermilk E, DePalma M, et al. Prospective, multicenter, randomized, crossover clinical trial comparing the safety and effectiveness of cooled radiofrequency ablation with corticosteroid injection in the management of knee pain from osteoarthritis. Reg Anesth Pain Med. 2018 Jan;43(1):84-91. Cooled radiofrequency ablation is better than a single corticosteroid injection for arthritic knee pain.
- Gatchel RJ, Reuben DB, Dagenais S, et al. Research agenda for the prevention of pain and its impact: Report of the work group on the prevention of acute and chronic pain of the federal pain research strategy. J Pain. 2018 Aug; 19(8):837-851. Public education is top priority.

- Opioid drugs work similarly to endorphins on nerve cell surface, but have additional intercellular effects explaining their hazards.
- Brief video on how to "Tame the Beast" of chronic pain and how science is changing the way we are thinking about it.
- New Interprofessional Pain Education Modules released by the Centers of Excellence for Pain Education (CoEPE) program
- Enhanced Recovery After Surgery protocols are available for different abdominopelvic surgical procedures.
- The National Pain Report features chronic pain stories, emerging treatments, public policy; with perspectives of specialists & patients.

Complementary Integrative Health (formerly called Complementary Alternative Medicine [CAM])

- Acupuncture cuts joint pain and may improve adherence to aromatase inhibitors for those with breast cancer.
- Exposure to <u>music or heartbeat sounds appear to help newborns</u> undergoing potentially painful procedures.
- Peripheral Nerve Stimulation may be a feasible treatment for pain after total knee arthroplasty while reducing undesired medication effects.
- Use of a non-drug protocol to reduce pediatric pain effectively lowers the prevalence & severity of needle-induced pain.
- Progressive muscle relaxation reduced discomforts & medication (analgesic &/or psychotropic) use among cancer patients.
