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In the News

- Opioid overdoses disproportionately affect different populations; supporting a need for focused support & access to care.
- OxyContin-maker pleads guilty to 3 federal crimes with an \$8 billion settlement forcing Purdue to become a public benefit company.
- Mallinckrodt files for bankruptcy over opioid crisis due to unmanageable legal liabilities, as stocks dip to under a dollar.
- Online salesman of fentanyl-laced counterfeit analgesics targeted patients who were unable to get opioid refills from their doctors.
- Dec. 11th the FDA will hold a workshop "Opioid Analgesics Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy" and are seeking public comments.
- Drug Takeback Day collected nearly a million pounds of unused/unwanted drugs, but it's unclear how many opioids were returned.
- Recently approved opioid oliceridine was assigned a Schedule II classification by the DEA, like other intravenous (IV) opioids.

- Tauben DJ, Langford DJ, Sturgeon JA, et al. Optimizing telehealth pain care after COVID-19. Pain. 2020 Nov;161(11):2437-45. Multidisciplinary telehealth pain treatments could work if obstacles & reimbursement challenges can be overcome
- Varas V, Bertinelli P, Carrasco P, Intraoperative ketamine and magnesium therapy to control postoperative pain after abdominoplasty and/or liposuction: a clinical randomized trial. *J Pain Res* 2020 Nov (13): 2937—46. Co-administration of intraoperative ketamine plus magnesium cut pain & opioid use first 12 hours after surgery. No more side effects were observed in those getting study drugs vs. placebo.
- Pradal J. Comparison of skin permeation and putative anti-inflammatory activity of commercially available topical products containing ibuprofen and diclofenac. *J Pain Res* 2020:13: 2805—14. Although ibuprofen may penetrate better, topical diclofenac may have superior anti-inflammatory activity with compound concentration, salt & excipients playing a role. Implications to practice & research are delineated.
- Karran EL, Grant AR, Moseley GL. <u>Low back pain and the social determinants of health</u>: a systematic review and narrative synthesis. *Pain*. 2020 Nov;161(11):2476-93. Educational attainment & socioeconomic status are important social determinants of health with low back pain.
- Wu CY, Lin HC, Chen SF, et al. Efficacy of pulsed <u>radiofrequency in herpetic neuralgia</u>: a meta-analysis of randomized controlled trials. *Clin J Pain*. 2020 Nov;36(11):887-95. Pulsed radiofrequency treatment effectively controls refractory postherpetic neuralgia pain.
- The United States Drug Enforcement Administration and prescription opioid production quotas: An end game of eradication? *J Pain Res.* 2020 Oct (13) 2629-31. <u>DEA reduction in production quotas despite COVID opioid shortages</u> raises questions about the DEA's intentions.
- Montes A, Roca G, Statistics JC, et al. Presurgical risk model for chronic postsurgical pain based on six clinical predictors: a prospective external validation. *Pain*. 2020 Nov;161(11):2611-18. New model predicts which patients will develop chronic postsurgical pain with 70% accuracy, based on six factors including pain intensity, age, gender, obesity, emotional state (e.g. anxiety, depression) and substance use.
- Motov S, Butt M, Masoudi A, et al. Comparison of oral ibuprofen and acetaminophen with either analgesic alone for pediatric Emergency
 Department patients with acute pain. *J Emerg Med*. 2020 May;58(5):725-32. Oral ibuprofen & acetaminophen have similar efficacy for
 short-term treatment of acute pain in the pediatric Emergency Department. It is unclear if combining the two has any added benefit.

- Turan A, Leung S, Bajracharya GR, et al. Acute postoperative pain is associated with myocardial injury after noncardiac surgery. Anesth Analg. 2020 Sep;131(3):822-829. Heart muscle damage can occur with sustained high pain levels the first 3 days after surgery.
- Merrer J, Chantry AA, Khoshnood B, et al.. Determinants of the use of <u>nonpharmacological analgesia for labor pain</u> management: a national population-based study. *Pain*. 2020 Nov;161(11):2571-2580. Nondrug methods combined with neuraxial analgesia mainly depends on the woman's preference, socioeconomic factors, quality of prenatal care, and organization's resources. Only 6% used nondrug therapies alone.
- Janevic MR, Shute V, et al. The role of pets in supporting cognitive-behavioral chronic pain self-management: perspectives of older adults. *J Appl Gerontol.* 2020 Oct;39(10):1088-1096 Although a burden to some, pets help many older adults learn & use CBT coping techniques..
- Markman JD, Bolash RB, McAlindon TE, et al. Tanezumab for chronic low back pain: a randomized, double-blind, placebo- and active-controlled, phase 3 study of efficacy and safety. Pain. 2020 May 19;161(9):2068-78. An anti-NGF Tanezumab improves back pain & function.
- Ghoshal M, Shapiro H, Todd K, et al. Chronic noncancer pain management and systemic racism: time to move toward equal care standards. *J Pain Res* 2020 (13): 2825—36. Racial injustice in pain care can't be ignored; a time for action to improve access to quality pain care.
- LeVoir A, Lee M, Fitzgibbon D, et al. <u>Chronic opioid therapy in cancer survivors</u> at a specialty oncology pain clinic: opioid dosing, efficacy and safety over five years of pain management. *J Pain Symptom Manage*. 2020 Nov 10:S0885-3924(20)30866-6. Of 180 patients on opioids for post-cancer treatment chronic pain; most had stable or lower doses over 5 years, with only 1 showing aberrant behavior or serious effects.

Complementary Integrative Health

- Meta-analysis shows moderate evidence that <u>acupuncture &/or acupressure reduces cancer pain</u> while reducing analgesic use.
- Evidence-based decision aid assists in choosing complementary and integrative approaches that reduce pain in children with cancer.
- <u>Virtual Reality helps patients with chronic pain</u> develop coping skills in a way that is highly engaging with a low side effect burden.
- New study examines disparities in race of the experience and relief of knee osteoarthritis with mindfulness and transcranial stimulation.
- <u>Kinesio taping reduces shoulder pain</u>, subluxation, & improves arm functioning and activities of daily living in patients with hemiplegia.
- Cryoneurolysis & percutaneous peripheral nerve stimulation are promising innovations to relieve acute pain for weeks without drugs.
