### In the News

Controversially, a long-time source of information and advocacy for those with pain, the American Pain Foundation shut down on May 3rd

- DEA threatens to revoke retail pharmacy license that dispense oxycodone in response to CDC's battle-cry to stop the opioid "epidemic."
- Tradic death of a 2 year old reminds us to be vigilant about proper disposal of fentanyl patches to avoid inadvertent exposure. .
- In their study of 26 cases over the past 15 years the FDA warns the public against accidental pediatric exposures to Fentanyl patches •
- What the FDA plans for making opioids safer to reduce alarming trends in diversion, addiction and accidental deaths from overdose. .
- U.S. senators passed an amendment to am FDA reauthorization bill that would reclassify all hydrocodone substances as Schedule CII

Arch Pediatr Adolesc Med. (ePub ahead of print): A 2004-2008 national survey showed when teens are most likely to start unsupervised prescription opioid use is 15-18 year olds. About 2.8% studied (age 12-21) used opioids
- Novikova N, Cluver C. (2012). Local anaesthetic nerve block for pain management in labour. Cochrane Database Syst Rev. 2012 Apr 18 . 4:CD009200. Nerve blocks provide superior pain relief in Labor than opioids, non-opioids or placebo without increasing complications.
- Portenoy RK, Ganae-Motan ED, Allende S, et al. (2012). Nabiximols for opioid-treated cancer patients with poorly-controlled chronic • pain: a randomized, placebo-controlled, graded-dose trial. J Pain, 13 (5):438-449. Nabiximols, a fixed ratio compound of THC and Cannabidiol had analgesic & anti-inflammatory effects with few psychoactive effects when used with 10 or fewer oromucasal sprays/day
- Hung WW, Egol KA, Zuckerman JD, et al. (2012). Hip Fracture Management: Tailoring Care for the Older Patient JAMA, 307(20):2185-2194. Nice review, indicating Only 13% have analgesic orders for analgesics during hospitalization that results in longer length of stay, missed physical therapy sessions, delayed ambulation, and poorer locomotion at 6 months. Shows evidence level of treatment options.

- Jackson JL, Kuriyama A, Hayashino Y. (2012). Botulinum Toxin A for Prophylactic Treatment of Migraine and Tension Headaches in Adults. *JAMA, 307*(16):1736-45. A meta-analysis of RCTs, showed a small benefit of botulinum toxin A with certain headaches.
- Herndon CM, Strassels SA, Strickland JM, et al.(2012). Consensus recommendations from the strategic planning summit for pain and palliative care pharmacy practice. J Pain Symptom Manage;43 :925-944. Pharmacists are an integral part of the health team, but may lack formal training in Pain and Palliative Care subspecialties. See basic & advanced pain education strategies for pharmacists.
- Kaasboll J, Lydersen S, Indredavik MS. (2012). Psychological symptoms in children of parents with chronic pain-the HUNT study. Pain, 153 (5):1054-62. <u>When parents have chronic pain</u> parents their children are at twice the risk of being troubled by anxiety/depression.
- Bailey B, Gravel J, Daoust R. (2012). Reliability of the <u>visual analog scale in children</u> with acute pain in the emergency department. *Pain, 153*(4):839-842. Although considered reliable, the Visual Analogue Scale has a margin of error of over 20% in children.

- New National Comprehensive Cancer Network has updated definitions and guidelines for Palliative Care (see supportive care/ free login)
- Validated tools to identify patients at risk for opioid problems before (SOAPP) or after (COMM) prescribed (English or Spanish versions)
- Helpful Evidence-based pocket guidelines on Pain Management in the Older Adult; Low Back Pain; Fibromyalgia, and opioid therapy

## CAM (Complementary and Alternative Medicine)

- NCCAM has a focus on complementary and alternative therapies for low back pain, including spinal manipulation
- Butterbur is effective for migraine prevention with strong evidence according to new guidelines it reduces headache frequency / severity.
- <u>Therapeutic massage for neck pain</u> works as well as physiotherapy or kinesiotherapy to reduce pain and improve range of motion.
