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In the News

- A <u>class-action lawsuit against opioid makers and distributors</u> is a more complex "blame game" than the tobacco case it emulates.
- Opioid prescriptions down 22%, Narcan, CE and PDM Program use up in past five years, but access to care is limited.
- Massachusetts opioid deaths down in 2017 with 85% involving illicit fentanyl. Cocaine & benzos increasingly implicated.
- Impaired driving fatalities rising, with 38% positive for marijuana, 16% opioids and 4% both; with alcohol and drug deaths up.
- FDA takes action against 53 websites marketing unapproved opioids as part of a comprehensive effort to target illegal online sales.
- Calcitonin gene-related peptide blockers are "game-changers" to prevent and treat migraines.
- National Institutes of Health plans to fund chronic pain research to better understand it's pathophysiology & develop new treatments.
- CMS to remove pain satisfaction scores from Hospital Compare, public databases & HCAHPS Quality Star Rating.
- Generic Buprenorphine/Naloxone sublingual film approved for uses in multiple strengths for opioid addiction.

- Niknejad B, Bolier R, Henderson CR Jr, et al. Association between psychological interventions and chronic pain outcomes in older adults: A systematic review and meta-analysis. *JAMA Intern Med.* 2018 Jun 1;178(6):830-39. Cognitive behavioral modalities help adults over age 60 reduce pain, maladaptive beliefs & improve confidence in the ability to self-manage pain; especially when group therapy is used.ls.
- Anim-Somuah M, Smyth RM, Cyna AM, et al. Epidural versus non-epidural or no analgesia for pain management in labour. Cochrane
 Database Syst Rev. 2018 May 21;5:CD000331. Epidural analgesia during labor provides less pain & improved maternal satisfaction than
 non-epidural methods despite more hypotension, motor blockade, fever, and urinary retention. Prolonged early labor & more frequent use
 of oxytocin were seen along with less risk of respiratory depression, nausea/vomiting than women receiving opioids.
- Weinstein EJ, Levene JL, Cohen MS, et al. Local anaesthetics and regional anaesthesia versus conventional analgesia for <u>preventing</u> <u>persistent postoperative pain in adults and children</u>. Cochrane Database Syst Rev. 2018 Apr 25;4:CD007105. Patients who receive regional anesthesia (epidural / nerve block) are less likely to develop chronic postsurgical pain after thoracotomy or breast cancer surgery.
- Higgins C, Smith BH, Matthews K. Incidence of iatrogenic opioid dependence or abuse in patients with pain who were exposed to opioid analgesic therapy: a systematic review and meta-analysis. *Br J Anaesth*. 2018;120:1335-44. Less than <u>5% of patients develop iatrogenic dependence or abuse when prescribed opioids for pain. The meta-analysis included 12 studies of 310,408 patients prescribed opioids.</u>
- Wang L, Chang Y, Kennedy SA, et al. Perioperative psychotherapy for persistent post-surgical pain and physical impairment: a meta-analysis of randomised trials. Br J Anaesth. 2018;120:1304-1314. Perioperative CBT &/or relaxation training effectively cuts persistent pain & physical impairment after surgery among 2,200 patients studied; in some studies, benefits were seen after one training session.
- Schwenk ES, Viscusi ER, Buvanendran, et al. Consensus guidelines on the use of intravenous ketamine infusions for acute pain from the ASRA, AAAPM & ASA. Reg Anesth Pain Med. 2018 Jun: 43(5): [ePub]. Evidence supports the use of ketamine for acute pain in a variety of contexts, including as a stand-alone treatment, as an adjunct to opioid therapy. Also see their guideline ketamine for chronic pain.

- Geenen R, Overman CL, Christensen R, et al. EULAR recommendations for the health professional's approach to pain management in inflammatory arthritis and osteoarthritis. Ann Rheum Dis. 2018 Jun;77(6):797-807. Overall, physical activity, exercise & psychological interventions overall have positive effects on pain. All arthritis patients should receive education on multimodal therapy if monotherapy fails.
- Drew DJ, Gordon DB, Morgan B, et al. "As-Needed" range orders for opioid analgesics in the management of pain: a consensus statement of the American Society for Pain Management Nursing and the American Pain Society. Pain Manag Nurs. 2018 Jun;19(3):207-210. Competency in pain assessment, analgesic administration, and monitoring is needed to safely interpret & implement properly written "PRN" range orders.
- Yezierski RP, Hansson P. Inflammatory and neuropathic pain from bench to bedside: what went wrong? J Pain. 2018 Jun;19(6):571-588. Requiring rodent trials may delay development of human pain treatments because of key differences with the human pain experience.
- Han CJ, Chi NC, Han S, et al. Communicating caregivers' challenges with cancer pain management: an analysis of home hospice visits. J Pain Symptom Manage. 2018 May:55(5):1296-1303. Communication and educational tools designed to reduce caregivers' barriers to pain management would likely improve clinical practice, patient & caregiver-related outcomes.
- Beaudoin FL, Gutman R, Zhai W, et al. Racial differences in presentations and predictors of acute pain following motor vehicle collision. *Pain*. 2018 Jun;159(6):1056-1063. Racial disparities are evident by differences not explained by socio-economic status or mechanism of injury.

- Brain imager Dr. Coghill, discusses the physiology of neurologic changes that transition acute to chronic pain.
- Brief synopsis & helpful visual aid for understanding persistent post-surgical pain & risks like pain, opioids & surgical method.
- Is using medical cannabis in addition to or instead of opioids, a sound harm-reduction plan? Research is still unclear.
- Shifting approaches to helping people with chronic pain, by integrating self-management & opioid-sparing strategies.
- Difficult to treat <u>neuropathic pain may result from autoantibodies</u> against the pain-stopping protein CASPR2.
- The 10 favorite pediatric Apps for pain and symptom management compiled by Children's Hospitals and Clinics of Minnesota.
- Newly discovered proteins are responsible for creating & maintaining a pain memory, but a SPOT-ON treatment may help.
- New comparative effectiveness trials report for noninvasive nondrug treatments from common chronic pain conditions.

Complementary Integrative Health (formerly called Complementary Alternative Medicine [CAM])

- Meta-analysis of 20,000 patients show acupuncture is effective for chronic pain with sustained benefits.
- Music for pain or anxiety is used before and during a biopsy, but is most effective after the procedure.
- Minimally invasive <u>peripheral nerve stimulator cuts pain</u> by disrupting pain signals before they reach the brain.
