In the News

- The DEA plans to cut prescription opioid supply in 2022 for the 6th year in a row citing a 20% cut in "medical need" for opioids in the U.S...
- The Oklahoma Supreme Court overturned a \$465 million ruling against Johnson & Johnson for its role in the opioid crisis.
- Massachusetts opioid overdose deaths rose 1% through September 2021 (primarily illicit fentanyl) compared to the same time last year.
- Oral Ketamine for treating Complex Regional Pain Syndrome has been granted orphan drug status by the FDA.
- FDA issues a recall of Methocarbamol 500mg that contain 750mg in Lot Number 163935/ Exp. Date 10/22.
- Why modern medicine struggles with treating chronic pain and how personal insights, self-help & hope succeed where medicine fails.
- FDA approves the first virtual reality device for chronic back pain with embedded Cognitive Behavioral Therapy & breathing biofeedback.
- Walmart, Walgreens & CVS pharmacies found liable for Ohio's opioid crisis disregarding their therapeutic role in treating pain.

Perioperative pain control should target condition-specific functioning, pain intensity at rest & with activity, adverse events & self-efficacy.
- Garrett SB, Nicosia F, Thompson N, et al. Barriers and facilitators to older adults' use of nonpharmacologic approaches for chronic pain. *Pain*. 2021 Nov 1;162(11):2769-79. Appeal, accessibility & the patients' awareness of nondrug methods influence their use by older adults
- Navratilova E, Fillingim RB, Porreca F. <u>Sexual dimorphism in functional pain syndromes</u>. *Sci Transl Med*. 2021 Nov 10;13(619):eabj7180. Neuroendocrine differences of some pain syndromes more prevalent & disabling in women, supports developing gender-specific therapy.
- O'Brien CM, Ntoumanis N, Duda JL, et al. Pain and fatigue ... are longitudinally and bi-directionally associated with more sedentary time and less standing time in rheumatoid arthritis. *Rheumatology* 2021 Oct 2;60(10):4548-4557. RA pain & fatigue linked to being sedentary.
- Viel E, Eerdekens M, Kandaswamy P. Treatment impact on patient-reported outcomes in peripheral neuropathic pain: comparing single intervention with topical high-concentration capsaicin to daily oral pregabalin. *Pain Physician*. 2021 Sep;24(6):453-463. A single application of high-concentration capsaicin application works guicker & is as effective as pregabalin at 8 weeks with fewer systemic side effects.
- Ziadni MS, Gonzalez-Castro L, Anderson S, et al. Efficacy of a single-session "Empowered Relief" Zoom-delivered group intervention for chronic pain: randomized controlled trial conducted during the COVID-19 pandemic. J Med Internet Res 2021;23(9):e29672. One-time "Empowered Relief" Zoom session makes treating chronic pain accessible in a feasible, engaging way to reduce symptom burden.

- Yang CP, Liang CS, Chang CM, et al. Comparison of new pharmacologic agents with triptans for treatment of migraine: a systematic review
 and meta-analysis. JAMA Netw Open. 2021 Oct 1;4(10):e2128544. <u>Triptans are more likely than CGRP antagonists to relieve migraine two
 hours after administration</u>. The Calcitonin Gene-related Peptide (CGRP) antagonist class is better for those with cardiovascular risks.
- Wang L, Tobe J, Au E, et al. Selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors and serotonin-norepinephrine reuptake inhibitors as adjuncts for
 postoperative pain management: systematic review and meta-analysis of randomised controlled trials. *Br J Anaesth*. 2021 Oct 28:S00070912(21)00613-9. SNRIs but not SSRIs help reduce acute & chronic postoperative pain and opioid consumption with few adverse events.

- Nielsen NI, Kehlet H, et al. High-dose steroids in high pain responders undergoing total knee arthroplasty: a randomised double-blind trial. *Br J Anaesth*. 2021 Nov 5:S0007-0912(21). Higher dose preoperative steroid cuts pain with movement a day after TKA without side-effects.

- Roundtable discussion on the differences between episodic vs. chronic migraine pathophysiology, treatments and access to care.
- Infographic well summarizes recommendations for deciding if medical cannabinoids should be tried for chronic pain.

Complementary Integrative Health

- Mirror therapy helps reduce phantom limb pain, more for longer duration pain; but sustained benefits are unclear.
- Pain Reprocessing Therapy cuts primary chronic back pain over the course of this 4-week psychological treatment.
- Music, rhythm, singing & dancing help people with pain by changing the arousal level within the nervous system.
- Adding TENS after cardiothoracic surgery, cuts pain & opioid use while improving pulmonary functioning.
- White noise cut blood draw pain in premature babies better than a lullaby, as nondrug methods reduce pain, VS changes & cortisol levels.
- Topical cold applied to the incision after abdominal surgery has little, if any effect on postoperative pain & analgesic use.
