Overview	Funding for this grant supports research studies initiated by MGH staff nurses for the purpose of advancing nursing science and improving outcomes for patients and families. The intent is that the research studies support and advance Patient Care Services annual strategic goals and the professional practice model. Completed studies are featured as presentations throughout the year at quarterly Munn Nursing Research Grand Rounds and Nursing Research Day. Up to 3 applicants are funded annually, based on available funds.					
Grant Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RN employed at MGH in staff nurse role working at least 20 hrs/week as a permanent benefits eligible MGH employee. • Part-time nurses are encouraged to work collaboratively with a full-time co-PI. • Registered nurses currently enrolled in a doctoral program or at the post-doctoral level are not eligible. • Each team is required to have a mentor to provide guidance and oversight, and to enhance the rigor of the investigation. The nurse mentor must have a PhD; however, a team-based mentoring approach consisting of a PhD and DNP prepared nurse is also acceptable. The Munn Award Committee and the Munn Center, can provide assistance to potential applicants with locating a mentor. • It is not necessary to have MGH Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval prior to proposal submission; however, all funded proposals must be reviewed and approved by the MGH IRB before the study is conducted. • If funded, all nurses participating in research studies must complete the IRB's on-line educational program, Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) (http://www.citiprogram.org), prior to beginning the study. One applicant is funded annually.

Overview	This award is supported by the Occupational Health Services and the Harvard Center for Work Health and Well-being. These studies are initiated by MGH nurses for the purpose of advancing science related to healthcare workforce and improving outcomes for patient care workers. Studies must support National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Total Worker Health goals. Total Worker Health™ is a strategy integrating occupational safety and health protection with health promotion to prevent worker injury and illness and to advance health and well-being. One applicant funded annually.

Connell Postdoctoral Fellowship in Nursing Research

Overview	<p>This is a unique opportunity for post-doctoral training at MGH, one of the leading hospital-based research programs in the U.S. The fellowship provides developmental support and resources to advance nursing research in Symptom Science and Nursing Workforce Evaluation. The program's overall objective is to cultivate expertise among nurses in the conduct of clinical studies that will improve patient care delivery. Highlights of the Connell Post-doctoral Fellowship:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Salary support with benefits for up to 3 years. • Expert mentorship from accomplished nurse scientists within the Munn Center and across MGH and associated institutions. • Diverse training and research development opportunities within and outside of MGH, including Harvard Medical School and local nursing schools. • Collaboration with the MGH Postdoc Association which provides extensive support for research advancement, career development, communication and networking, and fosters community among MGH's 1500 postdoctoral trainees. 												
Grant Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Early career nurse researcher within two years of completing a PhD degree. • Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to a career in research and their willingness to complete the 3-year fellowship. Those with academic appointments at the faculty level or are tenured or in a tenure track position are not eligible to apply. • Registered nurses who have completed an undergraduate or graduate degree in nursing. • PhD from U.S. certified institution of higher education received in the eligible year (documented by official sealed transcript). • Individuals with a defined area of research concentration and an emerging publication record. • Current PhD students must provide a letter from their dissertation chair confirming they have met all required course fulfillments and are on track to defend their dissertation and will graduate prior to commencement of the fellowship. Fellowship cannot commence without final receipt of diploma prior to July 1 or an agreed upon start for the fellowship.

The Yvonne L. Munn Predoctoral Research Grant for PhD Students

Grant Amount	\$2,500												
Overview	The Yvonne L. Munn Predoctoral Research Grant for PhD Nursing Students (previously the Munn Pre-Postdoctoral Fellowship) supports nurses in PhD programs currently pursuing their dissertation research. This \$2,500 grant is merit based and provides funding for research-related expenses for up to 2 years. Upon completion of the award, it is expected that the recipient will present findings at minimum to the MGH nursing community in both poster and podium formats, and a submit a manuscript in a peer reviewed scholarly journal.
