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In the News

Endo launches a full line of crush-resistant Opana ER (oxymorphone HCl extended-release) with 5, 7.5, 10, 15, 20, 30 and 40mg tablets. •

- Endo Sues the FDA over the STOPP Act designed to transition all abusable opioids to abuse deterrent and/or tamper resistant formulas. .
- A recall of certain Hydrocodone tablets made by Qualitest between 2/20/12 11/19/12 as the 10mg/500mg tablets may be oversized. .
- The FDA will discuss reclassifying all hydrocodone products from Schedule III to the stricter Schedule II category on January 24-25. •
- Should the FDA support generic abuse-prone opioid formulations or pull them as unsafe compared to costlier abuse deterrent versions?
- FDA will hold public hearings on opioid use for chronic pain Feb. 7-8, 2013 that could change labeling and considerably impact practice.

Using a conservative estimate, the • price-tag of pain in America at \$560-635/year costs more than heart disease (\$309 billion) and cancer (\$243 billion) combined, more than accidents (\$205 billion) & diabetes (\$127 billion), digestive system diseases (\$112 billion), and respiratory system diseases (\$112 billion).
- Derry S, Moore RA, Rabbie R. (2012). Topical NSAIDs for chronic musculoskeletal pain in adults. Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews, 9 CD007400. doi: 10.1002/14651858 Topical NSAIDs provide good relief from knee & hand arthritis pain & few GI side effects.
- Aubrun F, Mazoit JX, Riou B. (2012). Postoperative intravenous morphine titration. Br J Anaesth, 108:193-201. Review of safe/effective • postoperative IV morphine titration principles. Nice review covers young and old patients, in ER, PACU and general care settings
- Naugle KM, Fillingim RB, Riley JL 3rd. (2012). A meta-analytic review of the hypoalgesic effects of exercise. J Pain, 13(12):1139-50. • More intense, longer exercise lowers pain threshold in healthy adults, but those with chronic pain need moderate intensity short exercises
- Cohen S. (2012). Extended pain relief trial utilizing infiltration of Exparel®, a long-acting multivesicular liposome formulation of bupivacaine: a Phase IV health economic trial in adult patients undergoing open colectomy. J Pain Res, 2012 (5):567 - 572, Long-acting local anesthetic cuts hospital stay, costs and opioid consumption (2.9 days, \$3,084 and 58mg morphine equivalent) after a colectomy
- Simons LE, Kaczynski KJ, Conroy C, et al. (2012). Fear of pain in the context of intensive pain rehabilitation among children and adolescents with neuropathic pain: associations with treatment response. J Pain, 13 (12):1151-61. Fear of pain should be assessed in children on admission, as it predicts poor treatment outcomes. Lower fear is linked to better functioning at discharge & 2 month visit.

- Sheridan D, Foo I, O'Shea H,et al. (2012). Long-term follow-up of pain and emotional characteristics of women after surgery for breast cancer. *J Pain Symptom Manage, 44*(4):608-14. Pain after breast cancer may last for years and is linked to preoperative pain, and chemotherapeutic agent used, but not psychological factors like anxiety or depression. Constant pain was linked to more anxiety though.
- Behrend C, Prasarn M, Coyne E, et al. (2012). <u>Smoking cessation related to improved patient-reported pain</u> scores following spinal care *J Bone Joint Surg Am*, 94(23):2161-2166. Those who never smoked had less pain & disability. Quitting aided therapeutic response.
- Manchikanti L, Singh V, Cash KA, et al., (2012). Assessment of effectiveness of percutaneous adhesiolysis and caudal epidural injections
 in managing post lumbar surgery syndrome: 2-year follow-up of a randomized, controlled trial. J Pain Res, 5:597 608 Most patients
 with <u>failed back surgery</u> had 50% less pain & better functioning with percutaneous adhesiolysis vs. caudal epidural injections at 2 years.
- Houle TT, Butschek RA, Turner DP, et al. (2012) <u>Stress and sleep duration predict headache severity</u> in chronic headache sufferers. *Pain, 153* (12):2432-40. Yesterday and today's levels of stress and duration of sleep for the past 2 days best predicts headache occurrence and severity of headache pain. The risk for severe headaches increases proportionally with both high stress & little sleep.
- Middelkoop MV, Rubinstein SM, Ostelo R, et al. (2012). <u>No additional value of fusion techniques</u> on anterior discectomy for neck pain: A systematic review. *Pain*, *153*(11):2167-73. Risk benefits should carefully be weighed before adding fusion to an anterior discectomy.
