In the News

- The IASP Global Year Against Orofacial Pain began with a lot of resources TMD, Trigeminal neuralgia (TN) and other painful conditions.
- The FDA is requiring color changes to the Transdermal Fentanyl patches so they can be seen more easily.
- Zohydro ER is the first <u>FDA-approved Hydrocodone Extended Release</u> opioid product without a dose-limiting non-opioid. As a Schedule II
 ER opioid, REMS labeling limits its indication to pain that failed other treatments & is severe enough to require sustained, scheduled use.
- The FDA approved a 15mcg/hour new strength of Butrans (buprenorphine) to facilitate titration of the transdermal patch applied 1x a week.
- <u>National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day</u> educated millions on the need for safe disposal of unused medications to prevent their abuse.
- Electronic versions of ER/LA opioid REMS education are available on Medscape with an iBook version posted on the CO*RE website
- The FDA supports making all hydrocodone products a Schedule II drug. An affirmative FDA / DEA would make this happen early 2014.
- Lawmaker criticized the Veterans Affairs (VA) handling of pain because it does not involve pain specialists focuses too heavily on drugs.

- Carragee EJ, Chu G, Rohatgi R, et al. Cancer risk after use of recombinant bone morphogenetic protein-2 for spinal arthrodesis. *J Bone Joint Surg Am*. 2013 Sep 4;95(17):1537-45. The <u>use of bone growth factor during back surgery</u> was associated with major surgical complications in 11.% of patients. Most concerning was a nearly 7-fold increased risk of developing cancer within 2 years of surgery.
- Luckett T, Davidson PM, Green A, et al. Assessment and management of adult cancer pain: a systematic review and synthesis of recent qualitative studies aimed at developing insights for managing barriers and optimizing facilitators within a comprehensive framework of patient care. *J Pain Symptom Manage*. 2013 Aug;46(2):229-53. Tailoring interventions to the needs and preferences of the patient and family empower / educate them to pursue the multidisciplinary approach needed to overcome barriers to pain relief.
- Kelley M, Demiris G, Nguyen H, et al. Informal hospice caregiver pain management concerns: A qualitative study. *Palliat Med.* 2013 Jul;27(7):673-82. The most often identified area of burden for caregivers is the management of their loved one's pain & medications.
- Zale EL, Lange KL, Fields SA, et al. The relation between pain-related fear and disability: a meta-analysis. *J Pain*. 2013 Oct; 14(10): 1019-30. The fear of causing or worsening pain is immobilizing to the extent that clinicians should address it to lower disability.

- Derry CJ, Derry S, Moore RA. Single dose oral ibuprofen plus paracetamol (acetaminophen) for acute postoperative pain. *Cochrane Database Syst Rev.* 2013 Jun 24;6:CD010210. A single dose of <u>acetaminophen & ibuprofen cuts pain with fewer side effects</u> better than a single agent. Dental surgery patients achieved a 50% reduction in pain in 70% of cases and delayed or cut the need for opioids.
- Griffiths J, Hatch RA, Bishop J, et al. An exploration of social & economic outcome and associated health-related quality of life after critical illness in general intensive care unit survivors: a 12-month follow-up study. *Crit Care*. 2013 May 28;17(3):R100. Patients continue having problems 1 year after an ICU stay, including 70% with moderate or extreme pain; reduced mobility, quality of life & more caregiver burden
- Marin Gabriel MA, Del Rey Hurtado de Mendoza B, Jimenez Figueroa L, et al. Analgesia with breastfeeding in addition to skin-to-skin contact during heel prick. Arch Dis Child Fetal Neonatal Ed. 2013 Nov;98(6):F499-503. Skin to skin contact plus breast feeding reduces crying and other signs of pain better than skin-to-skin contact (SSC) or sucrose with or without SSC for term neonates during heel prick
- Sanga P, Katz N, Polverejan E, et al. Efficacy, Safety, and Tolerability of Fulranumab, an Anti-Nerve Growth Factor Antibody, in the
 Treatment of Patients with Moderate to Severe Osteoarthritis Pain. Pain, 2013 Oct;154(10):1910-9. A new subcutaneous drug derived
 from the human monoclonal anti-NGF antibody showed promise as a non-opioid treatment for chronic hip or knee osteoarthritis pain.
- Sia AT, Lim Y, Lim EC, et al. Influence of mu-opioid receptor variant on morphine use and self-rated pain following abdominal hysterectomy. *J Pain*. 2013 Oct;14(10):1045-52. Evidence mounts that OPRM1 gene explains difference in pain & post-op morphine use

Pain Resources on the Web

- Chronic pain or <u>fibromyalgia</u> adds stress to any relationship, but people can <u>keep pain from hurting a marriage</u> through concrete steps.
- Nice review of <u>CAM for osteoarthritis</u> on Medscape (free registration) discussing merits of diet, exercise, yoga and other CAM methods
- The Critical Care Pain Observation Tool (ccPOT) is reviewed with discussions by those who validated it and patient video clips they evaluate.

CAM (Complementary and Alternative Medicine)

- Ice packs plus morphine cut postoperative pain and medication use; supporting the value of combining nondrug and pharmacotherapy.
- Heat cuts labor pain when applied to a woman's back, lower abdomen, groin, and/or perineum every 30 minutes until dilated to 8cm.
- A systematic review and meta-regression analysis showed that <u>Low Level Laser Therapy</u> helps certain forms of chronic neck pain.
