- Cho AR, Kwon JY, Kim KH, et al. (2013). The [effects of anesthetics on chronic pain after breast cancer surgery](#). *Anesth Analg*, 116 (3):685-93. Using propofol instead of sevoflurane lowers acute postoperative pain, analgesic needs & subsequent chronic pain.
- Morasco BJ, Lovejoy TI, Lu M, et al. (2013). The relationship between [PTSD and chronic pain](#): Mediating role of coping strategies and depression. *Pain*, 154(4):609-616. Guarding, resting & asking for help may contribute to disability in those with both PTSD & chronic pain.
- Baldacci F, Vedovello M, Ulivi M, et al. (2013). Triggers in allodynic and non-allodynic migraineurs. A clinic setting study. *Headache*, 53 (1):152-60. [Migraine-related allodynia](#) (pain triggered by gentle stimuli) suggests a different mechanism linked to more headaches.
- World Health Organization. (2012). WHO guidelines on the [pharmacological treatment of persisting pain in children](#) with medical illnesses. WHO Press, World Health Organization, 20 Avenue Appia, 1211 Ave. Geneva 27, Switzerland. Good review / guidance.
- Radcliff K, Kepler C, Hilibrand A, et al. (2013). [Epidural steroid injections](#) are associated with less improvement in patients with lumbar spinal stenosis: a subgroup analysis of the Spine Patient Outcomes Research Trial. *Spine*, 38(4):278-291. Those treated with epidural steroids for stenosis did not have less pain or better functioning in 4 years and did worse in other ways, with or without later surgery.
- Menant JC, Wong A, Sturnieks DL, et al. (2013). Pain and anxiety mediate the relationship between [dizziness and falls in older people](#). *J Am Geriatr Soc*, 61(3):423-8. Older adults with neck or back pain had poorer balance, less strength and are more likely to fall if dizzy.
- Gardiner C, Gott M, Ingleton C, et al. (2012). Attitudes of health care professionals to [opioid prescribing in end-of-life care](#): a qualitative focus group study. *J Pain Symptom Manage*, 44(2):206-14. Persistent gaps in knowledge, skills & attitudes exist & interfere with pain control even at the end of life. Patients & professionals are reluctant about using necessary doses that guidelines consider appropriate.

- Pagé MG, Stinson J, Campbell F, et al. (2013). Identification of pain-related psychological risk factors for the development & maintenance of [pediatric chronic postsurgical pain](#). *J Pain Res*, 6:167-180. After orthopedic or major general surgery, 22% have chronic pain. Pain intensity & unpleasantness, at 2 weeks predicted a 3-fold risk of pain at 6 months. Pain with anxiety at 6 months predicted pain at 1 year.
- Lourenço LM, Matthews M, Jamison RN. (2012). [Abuse-deterrent and tamper-resistant opioids](#): how valuable are novel formulations in thwarting non-medical use? *Expert Opin Drug Deliv*, 10(2):229-40. Screening is critical to patient selection; monitoring is then needed.
- Loeser JD, Cahana A. (2013). Pain medicine versus pain management: [ethical dilemmas created by contemporary medicine](#) and business. *Clin J Pain*, 29(4):311-6. Managing pain should be an obligation driven by ethics, not by money to "fix a broken part".
- Rhee YO, Kim E, Kim B. (2012). Assessment of pain and analgesic use in African American cancer patients: factors related to adherence to analgesics. *J Immigr Minor Health*, 14(6):1045-51. [Misconceptions about analgesics](#) reduced adherence to treatment.
