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In the News

- President Obama signed into law the <u>21st Century Cures Act</u>, address health challenges like addiction, cancer, & Alzheimer's disease.
- DEA opioid investigations came to a grinding halt despite signals of diversion in the peak of the crisis as "pill mills" flourished.
- The Nurses' Health Study, supports prior research (in both sexes) that chronic use of ibuprofen or acetaminophen is linked to hearing loss.
- Are Medicaid regulations designed to curtail prescription painkiller abuse solving the problem or making the access to pain treatment worse?
- Massachusetts law now requires <u>nursing homes to stock naloxone</u> and to train staff in its use to care for residents with addiction.
- FDA strengthens their block box warning that non-aspirin <u>NSAIDs can cause heart attacks or strokes</u> as early as the first weeks use.
- DEA registration renewal will continue to offer online renewals after January 1, 2017, reversing a proposed lengthy reinstatement process.
- In 2015, opioid deaths rose to 33,091 largely driven by a 20% increase in heroin deaths & a 72% increase in illicitly made fentanyl overdoses.
- A cluster of unintentional fentanyl & U-47700 overdoses seen North/Central California because tainted "Norco" purchased from illicit sources.

 Care Pharmacother. 2016;30(1):4-12. International guidelines list ways to prevent diversion of prescription opioids while ensuring patient
 access to appropriate medicines. Restrictive policies should be based on an accurate evaluation of how drugs are misused &/or diverted.

 WHO, & other international groups concur to access to pain management is a human rights & public policies should not infringed on them.
- Mohr AL, Friscia M, Papsun D, et al.. Analysis of novel synthetic opioids U-47700, U-50488 and Furanyl Fentanyl by LC-MS/MS in postmortem casework. *J Anal Toxicol*. 2016 Nov;40(9):709-717. Designer opioids responsible for fatal overdoses go undetected by most labs.
- Hogan TM, Howell MD, Cursio JF, et al. Improving Pain Relief in Elder Patients (I-PREP): An Emergency Department Education and Quality Intervention. J Am Geriatr Soc. 2016 Dec;64(12):2566-2571. The I-PREP education and QI program substantially improved assessment, pain relief and timely documentation for older adults in the ED presenting with moderate to severe musculoskeletal or abdominal pain.
- Mercadante S, Portenoy RK. <u>Breakthrough cancer pain</u>: twenty-five years of study. *Pain*. 2016 Dec;157(12):2657-63. Breakthrough cancer pain has good evidence to support the use of oral or transmucosal opioids to control it, despite some controversy about the concept & therapy

- Zempsky WT, Schmitz ML, Meyer JM. Safety and efficacy of needle-free powder lidocaine delivery system in adult patients undergoing venipuncture or peripheral venous cannulation: A randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled trial. Clin J Pain. 2016 Mar;32(3):211-7. The needle-free powder lidocaine applied 1-3 min before venous access procedures in adults significantly reduced or eliminated procedural pain.
- Brown CH 4th, LaFlam A, Max L, et al. Delirium after spine surgery in older adults: Incidence, risk factors, and outcomes. *J Am Geriatr Soc.* 2016 Oct;64(10):2101-2108. Delirium is linked to strong pain, over-hydration & antidepressants as risks for older spine surgery patients.
- Peerdeman KJ, van Laarhoven Al, Keij SM, et al. Relieving patients' pain with expectation interventions: A meta-analysis. *Pain*. 2016, 157:1179-1191. Verbal suggestions influencing expectations cut procedural pain better than other psychosocial interventions tested.
- Nicholas MK, Asghari A, Blyth FM, et al. Long-term outcomes from <u>training in self-management of chronic pain in an elderly</u> population: A randomised controlled trial. *Pain*. 2017 Jan;158(1):86-95. Pain, distress, disability, depression & fear-avoidance remain lower at 1 year.
- Bromberg MH, Law EF, Palermo TM. <u>Suicidal Ideation in adolescents</u> with and without chronic pain. *Clin J Pain.* 2017 Jan;33(1):21-27. Suicidal Ideation (SI) is common during adolescence and may have lethal outcomes; but pain is not a predictor of SI like it is for adults.
- Craner JR, Gilliam WP, Sperry JA. Rumination, magnification, and helplessness: how do <u>different aspects of pain catastrophizing</u> relate to pain severity and functioning? *Clin J Pain*. 2016 Dec;32(12):1028-35. Helplessness contributes most to pain intensity, disability & depression
- Valeri BO, Ranger M, Chau CM, et al. Neonatal invasive procedures predict pain intensity at school age in children born very preterm. Clin J Pain. 2016 Dec;32(12):1086-1093. Neonatal procedural pain affects school age pain during blood draws, independent of other factors.
