#### In the News

- Medical group question <u>ethics of legalizing of physician-assisted suicide</u> instead of providing care, respect & comfort patients deserve.
- Many <u>patients with severe/chronic pain often can't get Rx opioids</u> as many doctors have stopped prescribing given scrutiny by others.
- Marino won't be Drug Czar after and errant "60 Minute" report that through the "Ensuring Patient Access..." bill legislators misled the DEA.
- FDA approved Lyrica CR a daily pregabalin formulation for neuropathic pain associated with diabetes & postherpetic neuralgia.
- Drug errors involving opioids account for 24% of medical malpractice claims; more than any other drug class. (Free registration)
- National Academy of Medicine issues a guideline for responsible opioid prescribing & the recognition / treatment of substance use disorder.
- Lancet Commission aims to close the gap in access to pain relief & palliative care, deemed a moral, health & ethical imperative.
- Pain Society supports marijuana legislation that remove barriers to needed research on the effectiveness of cannabis as a therapeutic option.
- AMA guidelines for co-prescribing naloxone to patients at risk of opioid overdose, and influencing policies to improve access.
- Insys Therapeutics founder arrested for fraud & illegal distribution of Fentanyl spray approved for cancer pain, but used for noncancer pain.
- New spinal cord stimulator with a rechargeable battery can remotely track patient activity levels to guide therapy changes.
- Major chain pharmacy CVS to limit access to opioid analgesics & extend CDC recommendations beyond its intended target.
- The new federal research priorities related to pain are intended to guide strategic research planning and to support funding decisions.
- The FDA now recommends <u>flushing unused opioids down the toilet</u> if unable to dispose of them in a drug take-back program.
- Trump declares opioid addiction is a public health emergency, a short-term measure without readily available, allocated funding.

- Gomes T, Juurlink DN, Antoniou T, et al. <u>Gabapentin</u>, <u>opioids</u>, <u>and the risk of opioid-related death</u>: a population-based nested case-control study. *PLoS Med*. 2017; 14(10):e1002396. Co-prescribing gabapentin and opioids places patients at a significantly higher risk of overdose.
- Müller-Lissner S, Bassotti G, Coffin B, et al. <u>Opioid-induced constipation</u> and bowel dysfunction: A clinical guideline. *Pain Med*. 2017 Oct 1; 18(10):1837-63. The conventional laxatives remain the first choice, with new laxatives, also be effective in selected patients. Newer PAMORA products are effective for select cases of opioid-induced constipation. Best approach to upper GI side effects however, remains unclear.
- Guimarães-Pereira L, Reis P, Abelha F, et al. <u>Persistent postoperative pain after cardiac surgery</u>: a systematic review with meta-analysis regarding incidence and pain intensity. *Pain*. 2017 ct;158(10):1869-85. Over 35% of patients develop <u>chronic pain after heart surgery</u> with 16% still having the pain 2 years later; often at moderate to severe levels of intensity; which is lower than <u>rates following orthopedic surgery</u>.
- Gálvez R, Navez ML, Moyle G, et al. Capsaicin 8% patch repeat treatment in nondiabetic peripheral neuropathic pain: a 52-week, open-label, single-arm, safety study. *Clin J Pain*. 2017;33(10):921-931. A third of patients got a 30% cut in neuropathic pain with strong capsaicin patch.

- Stanton M, McClughen D. The CDC Guideline and its impact on delivering patient-centered care. Pain Manage Nurs 2017 Oct;18(5):270-2. As health care systems, policymakers & payers adopt mandatory, non-patient-centered policies; prescribers may find themselves having to choose between prescribing based on the standard of care (individualized therapy) & complying with policies or laws that usurp judgement.
- Matos M, Bernardes SF, Goubert L. Why and when social support predicts older adults' pain-related disability: a longitudinal study. Pain. 2017 Oct;158(10):1915-24. Review of social support strategies that cut functional dependence & promote older adults' healthy aging.
- Ilhan E, Chee E, Hush J, et al. The prevalence of neuropathic pain is high after treatment for breast cancer: a systematic review. Pain. 2017 Nov;158(11):2082-91. Neuropathic pain after breast cancer treatment has a higher prevalence than that linked to other forms of cancer.
- Macfarlane GJ, Barnish MS, Jones GT. Persons with chronic widespread pain experience excess mortality: longitudinal results from UK Biobank and meta-analysis. Ann Rheum Dis. 2017 2017 Nov;76(11):1815-22. Over 5 years & 500,000 people; chronic widespread pain confers a 60% higher all-cause mortality rate after age, gender, health & lifestyle factors were controlled for. Prevention may lower risk.
- Chan FKL, Ching JYL, Tse, YK, et al. Gastrointestinal safety of celecoxib versus naproxen in patients with cardiothrombotic diseases and arthritis after upper gastrointestinal bleeding: An industry-independent, double-blind, double-dummy, randomised trial. Lancet. 2017;389 (10087):2375-82. Patients using cardioprotective aspirin plus an NSAID should use celecoxib & proton-pump inhibitor to cut GI bleed risk.
- Peters ML, Smeets E, Feijge M, et al. Happy Despite Pain: A randomized controlled trial of an 8-week internet-delivered positive psychology intervention for enhancing well-being in patients with chronic pain Clin J Pain. 2017 Nov;33(11):962-75. An online CBT program helps
- Meng H, Johnston B, Englesakis M, et al. Selective cannabinoids for chronic neuropathic pain: A systematic review and meta-analysis. Anesth Analg. 2017 Nov;125(5):1638-52. Selective cannabinoids provide a on average 0.6/10 point reduction in neuropathic pain intensity.
- Hernandez-Boussard T, Graham LA, Desai K, et al. The fifth vital sign: Postoperative pain predicts 30-day readmissions and subsequent Emergency Department visits. Ann Surg. 2017 Sep;266(3):516-524. Uncontrolled pain has costly outcomes & patient dissatisfaction.
- Tedesco D, Asch SM, Curtin C, et al. Opioid abuse and poisoning: trends in inpatient and emergency department discharges. Health Aff 2017;36(10):1748-1753. Prescription opioid poisonings have been dropping since 2010, while heroin-related events have sharply increased.

- FDA approved the SpringTMS Transcranial Magnet Stimulation device to prevent/treat migraine headaches using a mild electric current.
- <u>Distraction is effective for pedi procedural pain management</u> but more insights are needed to select best methods for different populations.
