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In the News

- President Trump signed <u>a bundle of laws addressing the opioid crisis</u> to support affected patients & communities.
- FDA finalizes its opioid analgesic REMS (REMS) requires training of prescribers, nurses and pharmacists treating patients with opioids.
- CDC / National Health Survey results show chronic pain is a major public health problem affecting individual's health, families and society.
- A novel TRPV1-agonist is a promising experimental drug for postoperative pain that desensitizes pain-conducting nerve with a single shot.
- Opioid makers are required to provide unrestricted educational grants to teach according to the <u>revised FDA blueprint</u>.
- Recall issued for 2 lots of Robaxin (methocarbamol) 750mg Tabs due to incorrect dosing instructions on the label.
- DEA rescheduled Epidiolex (cannabidiol) oral solution to Schedule V, that may help neuropathic pain.
- Weekly or monthly injections of buprenorphine developed to treat addiction can help lower chronic low back pain.
- New imaging method shows fibromyalgia patients have widespread glial cell mediated neuroinflammation.
- A stealth nanosponge that absorbs pain-producing inflammatory proteins may revolutionize the treatment of rheumatoid arthritis.
- New topical anesthetic skin refrigerant applied with a cotton ball avoid some discomforts of the spray formula.
- FDA approves another CGRP medication to prevent migraines; one with monthly & guarterly injection options

- Berna C, Leknes S, Ahmad AH, et al. Opioid-independent and opioid-mediated modes of pain modulation. J Neurosci. 2018 Oct 17;38(42):9047-9058. Mental imagery can effectively diminish pain intensity and does not rely on a functioning opioidergic system.

- Stockings E, Campbell G, Hall WD, et al. Cannabis and cannabinoids for the treatment of people with chronic noncancer pain conditions: a systematic review and meta-analysis of controlled and observational studies. *Pain*. 2018 Oct;159(10):1932-1954. Evidence that cannabinoids help chronic pain is limited; with more people (16%) having undesired than (4%) people having significant pain reduction.
- Romanelli P, Conti A, Bianchi L, et al. Image-guided robotic radiosurgery for trigeminal neuralgia. *Neurosurgery*. 2018 Nov 1;83(5):1023-1030. Robotic radiosurgery alleviates trigeminal neuralgia pain, with most patients eliminating the need for analgesics within 3 months.
- Overton HN, Hanna MN, Bruhn WE, et al. Opioid-prescribing guidelines for common surgical procedures: an expert panel consensus. *J Am Coll Surg.* 2018 Oct;227(4):411-418. At Johns Hopkins, 30 stakeholders develop opinion-based dosing limit guidelines for 20 surgeries.

Complementary Integrative Health (formerly called Complementary Alternative Medicine [CAM])

- Meditative approaches & yoga help patients with musculoskeletal and mental health comorbidity.
- Highly arousing music engages more attentional resources, producing better distraction from pain and tolerance of it.
- Massage, thermal &/or manual methods help reduce labor pain while improving a women's sense of control & the emotional experience.
- Perioperative acupuncture, aromatherapy, imagery & music therapy help reduce pain & other discomforts after otolaryngology surgery.
- Breath-focused electrical stimulation cut pain & increased parasympathetic tone in spinal cord injured patients with neuropathic pain.
