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### In the News

- FDA warns about potentially toxic effects of homeopathic medicines used for pain and a host of other conditions
- Office of National Drug Control Policy leader is a 24 year-old whose qualifications stem from Trump's presidential campaign
- FDA label change/boxed warnings to prescription cough/cold medicines containing codeine or hydrocodone, now for adult use only.
- Opioids and STOP Pain Initiative needs legislative support to better understand and treat pain using alternatives to opioids
- Pain pioneer Margo McCaffery passed away. To honor her legacy, please support <u>ASPMN Research Fund</u>.
- Many of the 200 ways to treat pain never get used due to a lack of a broader understanding of pain & its treatment.
- Opioid misuse among teens reaches a historic low while vaping's popularity is rising & daily marijuana use is steady.
- President Trump signs law to enhance opioid detection in the mail, customs & borders to stop influx of illicit fentanyl.
- The opioid crisis hits home as abuse is linked to parental neglect-related child removal for foster home placement.
- Department of Justice shares data to find pill mills by examining the amount of opioids prescribed, distance patients travel & patient deaths.
- Sobering message: expect some pain after surgery; or expect addiction if striving to be pain free with opioids.
- President Trump uses his "Bully Pulpit," extending the opioid public health emergency for another 90 days amid criticism of inaction.

- Solomon DH, Husni ME, Libby PA, et al. <u>The risk of major NSAID toxicity with celecoxib, ibuprofen, or naproxen</u>: A secondary analysis of the PRECISION trial. *Am J Med*. 2017 Dec;130(12):1415-1422. Beyond a year of daily NSAID therapy, 5% will experience major cardiovascular, GI or renal events with 1% of patients dying. Among the 3 studied drugs, celecoxib had lowest & ibuprofen the highest rate of major toxicity.
- Matthias MS, Johnson NL, Shields CG, et al. I'm not gonna pull the rug out from under you: Patient-provider communication about opioid tapering. *J Pain*. 2017 Nov;18(11):1365-1373. Conversations about tapering chronic opioid therapy can be eased with insights about patient-centered explanations, negotiation, managing difficulties or misunderstandings and assurance they will not be abandoned.
- Siegel P, Tencza M, Apodaca B, et al. <u>Effectiveness of occupational therapy interventions for adults with rheumatoid arthritis: a systematic review</u>. *Am J Occup Ther*. 2017;71(1):71011. Strong evidence supports <u>nondrug methods of controlling RA pain</u> used by O.T.'s.
- Gudin, JA, Brennan MJ, Harris ED, et al. Reduction of opioid use and improvement in chronic pain in opioid-experienced patients after topical analysis treatment: an exploratory analysis. *Postgraduate Med.* 2018 Jan;130(1):42-51. Topical NSAIDs help many cut use of chronic opioids.
- St. Marie BJ, Arnstein PM, Zimmer PA. Pain and Opioids: Call for Policy Action. Jour Nurse Pract 2018. 14(1):40-44. Time limited access to full article, summarizing recent White Paper on Managing chronic pain with opioids highlighting what needs to change in light of the opioid crisis.
- Harbaugh CM, Lee JS, Hu HM, et al. Persistent opioid use among pediatric patients after surgery. Pediatrics. 2018 Jan;141(1). pii: e20172439.
   Nearly 5% of opioid naïve teens get an opioid refill 3-6 months after surgery warranting vigilance to prevent addiction, misuse & adverse effects
- Schmidt-Hansen M, Bennett MI, Arnold S, et al. Oxycodone for cancer-related pain. Cochrane Database Syst Rev. 2017 Aug 22;8:CD003870. Oxycodone may have slightly fewer side effects than oral morphine, with equivalent effectiveness. Oral morphine remains the 1st choice.

- Antcliff D, Campbell M, Woby S, et al. Activity pacing is associated with better and worse symptoms for patients with long-term conditions. Clin J Pain. 2017 Mar;33(3):205-214. Activity pacing education may help, but varying strategies may help or hurt. Different themes reviewed with "pacing" by adjusting/reducing activities worsening symptoms, while activity consistency improves chronic pain symptoms & functioning.
- Jensen CD, Stark JT, Jacobson LL, et al. Improved outcomes associated with the liberal use of thoracic epidural analgesia in patients with rib fractures. Pain Med. 2017 Sep 1;18(9):1787-1794. Thoracic epidurals significantly reduce mortality in rib fracture patients with severe injury.
- Zhu A, Benzon HA, Anderson TA. Evidence for the efficacy of systemic opioid-sparing analgesics in pediatric surgical populations: A systematic review. Anesth Analg. 2017 Nov;125(5):1569-1587. The available evidence suggests that perioperative acetaminophen, NSAIDs, dexamethasone, ketamine, clonidine & dexmedetomidine may lower postoperative pain & opioid consumption in some pediatric populations.
- Duerden EG, Grunau RE, Guo T, et al. Early procedural pain is associated with regionally-specific alterations in thalamic development in preterm neonates. J Neurosci 2017 Dec 18. pii: 0867-17. Procedural pain in very preterm neonates disrupts thalamic metabolic growth & thalamocortical pathway maturation linked to alterations in somatosensory-system development & poor cognitive/motor outcomes at 3 years.
- Kassianos AP, Ioannou M, et al. The impact of specialized palliative care on cancer patients' health-related quality of life: a systematic review & meta-analysis. Support Care Cancer. 2018 Jan; 26(1):61-79. Palliative care cuts pain, nausea & fatigue; improves physical / mental function
- Lee JW, Lee E, Lee GY, et al. Epidural steroid injection-related events requiring hospitalisation or emergency room visits among 52,935 procedures performed at a single centre. Eur Radiol. 2018 Jan;28(1):418-427. Complications hospitalize < 0.5% of epidural steroid patients
- Pergolizzi JV Jr, LeQuang JA, Taylor R Jr, et al. Going beyond prescription pain relievers to understand the opioid epidemic: the role of illicit fentanyl, new psychoactive substances, and street heroin. Postgrad Med. 2018 Jan;130(1):1-8. Overlooked contributors to the crisis reviewed.

# Complementary Integrative Health (formerly called Complementary Alternative Medicine [CAM])

- Periosteal Stimulation Therapy combined exercises reduces pain and functioning with knee arthritis better than TENS.
- Music reduces the intensity of chronic pain and depression; with the stronger pain relieving effects when music is self-chosen.
